# DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

2020 was an extraordinary year for us and other centers all across the nation. The COVID-19 pandemic changed many lives in many different ways. We struggled through lock-down periods and quarantines, however the staff remained resilient and continued to provide exceptional services. The number of child abuse reports saw a decline. Unfortunately, we know that was not due to children not being abused. In fact, we believe quarantine may have made it worse. COVID created the "perfect storm" for continuing abuse and creating new abusive situations. Due to children not being in school and being isolated at home, they were out of sight of teachers, friends and other mandatory reporters. Seeing these children in public is usually how suspected abuse is reported. The stressful environment that quarantine caused was a horrible recipe for parents, guardians, caretakers and others to more easily lose their patience. Now, in 2021, we are experiencing higher numbers of reports of abuse and children in need of our services. We have doubled the number of forensic interviews and tripled the number of SANE exams provided from the same period just last year.

The Garfield County Child Advocacy Council was founded in 1997. Co-founder and former Executive Director, Carole Wade dedicated 23 years of service to this organization. Her retirement in September 2020 left a legacy that Garfield County should be extremely proud of. I took on the role of Executive Director on September 8, 2020. This date is close to my heart, as I was hired by the Enid Police Department on the same date in 1997. Working as a juvenile detective in 2000, I saw the opening of the "Yellow House" at 1006 E. Broadway and also gave one of the very first forensic interviews at this location. I later served on the Board of Directors for GCCAC for 11 years while at the police department. I gave 23 years of dedicated service to the Enid Police Department. Wade and I started fighting child abuse at about the same time and spent many hours working together as colleagues. I spent seven years in the Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Division at Enid PD. I was also an ICAC task force officer for the Oklahoma Bureau of Investigations (OSBI) and the Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI). I have been challenged with evolving times, reorganizing the staff and cuts in funding.

I have been able to utilize the experience of the organization's most tenured staff member, Shelia McHenry, who has been with GCCAC for approximately eight years. Our current team is comprised of Shelia McHenry, TaShanna Armstrong, Melanie Milacek, Heather Jones and Kendra O'Hern. McHenry is a forensic interviewer and a victim advocate. She was recently designated as the CASA Program Manager. She oversees the Fourth Judicial District CASA Program which is a program under GCCAC. Armstrong is a CASA supervisor and a victim advocate. She was also trained as a forensic interviewer in December and has hit the ground running. We are blessed to have two forensic interviewers because of the amount of secondary trauma that these interviewers face by hearing the stories they hear. Milacek is a CASA supervisor and a victim advocate. She was originally the Executive Assistant, but her heart was in providing victim services. I was able to move her to her current position and hire a new Executive Assistant. Jones is a CASA supervisor for Kingfisher and Blaine Counties. O'Hern was just recently hired as the new Executive Assistant. Michelle Baldwin is a Sexual Assault Examiner Nurse (SANE) and she volunteers her time to provide sexual assault exams to children when applicable.

I want to thank my staff and board for their hard work and dedication. They truly love what they do and I am very blessed to have them. We really consider ourselves to be a family which makes the difficult nature of the job easier to handle. Our community can be very proud of the staff and board at GCCAC. I would like to thank the Department of Human Services (DHS) for continuing to fight for children and for being great partners. I want to thank all of the CASA volunteers who give of their time to help provide security and justice for abused children. I would also like to thank the United Way for being such an amazing and gracious partner to our organization.








